CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION REVIEW

Proposed Action: Temporary Use Permit for use of a temporary easement area to facilitate replacement of a culvert on Cook Road by Lane County.

DECISION RECORD
CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION REVIEW

Background: Lane County, Oregon, has applied for a Temporary Use Permit issued pursuant to 43 CFR 2800. The County is proposing to replace an existing culvert with a new, more "fish friendly" culvert across Cook Road on BLM lands located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, T. 17 S., R. 7 W., W.M.. The work area for the project will exceed the existing right-of-way by approximately 0.22 acres. The additional right-of-way area will allow for the storage of construction materials. The permit would be issued for a period of one year. No trees will be removed during construction and the area will be restored to its pre construction condition following operations. The County will adhere to all terms and limitations of a Corps of Engineers Section 404 Permit.

Proposed Action: The proposed action is the issuance to Lane County of a Temporary Use Permit to facilitate replacement of a culvert on Cook Road pursuant to the authority of Title V of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (43 U.S.C. 1761), subject to the terms and conditions in 43 CFR 2801 and those additional stipulations in the attached Exhibit B. The proposed area consists of approximately 0.22 acres of public land. No bonding should be required.

Decision: It is my decision to grant a Temporary Use Permit approximately 0.22 acres in area, for the facilitation of the replacement of a culvert on Cook Road, to Lane County, Oregon, for one year, on the following public land:

T. 17 S., R.7 W., W.M.
Sec. 1: SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$

The grant is made under the authority of Title V of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (43 U.S.C. 1761) and subject to the terms and conditions in 43 CFR 2801. The grant shall also be subject to the stipulations in the attached Exhibit B.

Rationale: The proposed action meets the criteria for the categorical exclusion in departmental manual 516 DM 6, Appendix 5.4E(19)(Issuance of a short term (3 years or less) rights-of-way or land use authorizations for such uses as storage sites, apiary sites, and construction sites where the proposal includes rehabilitation to restore the land to its natural or original condition.), and none of the exceptions in 516 DM 2, Appendix 2, apply. Further, the action is in conformance with the "Record of Decision for Amendments to Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management Planning Documents within the Range of the Northern Spotted Owl" (April 1994), and the "Eugene District Record of Decision and Resource Management Plan" (May 1995).
