


Welcome to the Shotgun OHV Trail System

The OHV trail system is located within the Eugene BLM District, northeast of Eugene/Springfield. It represents an interim state of managed trail opportunities available at this time. Future trail planning efforts will likely result in the creation of new trails and closure of some existing today. BLM welcomes the opportunity to work with trail enthusiasts during that process.

The interim trail system offers 24 miles of managed OHV routes including trails, primitive roads, and road-to-trail conversions. The routes are signed, mapped, and provide a range of challenge opportunities. They are connected by paved and graveled roads intersecting public and private lands. Support facilities include two staging sites. Elevation range is 758 to 2,864 feet.



Casual and competitive recreational opportunities are provided primarily for Class I (quads) and III (motorcycles) vehicles. One trail is open to Class II (4x4) vehicles. Authorized use is indicated on trail identification markers and the Shotgun OHV Trail System map. Off highway vehicles are allowed on signed trails and staging areas. Use of graveled roads to access signed trails is permitted by non-street legal vehicles. Use of paved roads by non-street legal vehicles is allowed **only** where signed.

All trails are open to non-motorized trail enthusiasts. Please watch for them; demonstrate good trail etiquette and yield them the right-of-way. Like you, they're seeking recreational enjoyment.



The Shotgun OHV Trail System exists within a landscape of public and private lands. Trails located on private lands are closed to OHV activity; similarly, some trails are physically blocked and/or signed closed to motorized vehicles on lands managed by the BLM for resource protection. Heed these signs and value the enjoyment that comes with responsible use of signed, managed trails open to OHV activity. A citation received for trespass, reckless endangerment, or resource damage does not enhance anyone's outdoor experience.

The checkerboard ownership pattern of public and private lands creates a **very challenging** environment in which Shotgun OHV trail recreation opportunities are managed. Your cooperation in following the rules, demonstrating Tread Lightly! principles, and being a volunteer partner helping to manage trail recreation opportunities are important ways you can help. As an OHV enthusiast, your responsible outdoor practices will positively impact your future privilege to ride.
